Flexible Learning Environments, Technology, UDL

Over the past 5 years, P.K. Yonge has focused on the development of increasingly **flexible learning environments**, now supported by **1:1 personal devices**. This work is carried out through a commitment to an **inclusive curriculum** guided by the principles of **Universal Design for Learning (UDL)**.

Now in the third year of our 1:1 device deployment, we share **work happening in classrooms** and the **planning and professional learning structures** that support the development of our **flexible learning environments**, facilitated by **technology** and guided by **UDL**.

Participants will **observe in classrooms**, and engage in **shared discussions** with P.K. Yonge educators about **designing instruction with the UDL framework**, **blending digital and face-to-face learning** to support students, and **considering space as an element of instructional design**.
