How to Pay for College

Dollars for Scholars Financial Aid Night was November 16th. In case you missed it, here are the highlights and resources!

• Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- *What?* The FAFSA is the application for federal student aid including grants and loans. The FAFSA is FREE!
- When?
 - The 2015-2016 application is currently open and available for students who plan to attend college in Summer 2016.
 - The 2016-2017 application will open on January 1, 2016. This application is for students who will be entering college Fall 2016.
 - Tip!- Complete the 15-16 FAFSA to get a head start on the 16-17 FAFSA. Most of your information will roll over so the application is easier to complete.
- *Who?* All seniors are encouraged to apply; Parents will need to assist with the income tax information
- Money is disbursed on a first come first serve basis so apply EARLY!

• Florida Financial Aid (including Bright Futures)

- *What?* Florida's application for state funded student aid including grants and scholarships (Bright Futures).
- *When?* Application opens up December 1st. Deadline to apply is August 31, 2016.
- *Who?* ALL seniors are encouraged to apply no matter what your plans are after graduation.
- $\circ~$ Classroom Guidance Lesson in February will include opportunity for seniors to apply in class.

• <u>Scholarships</u>

- *What?* Scholarships are free money! You do not need to pay back scholarships you win.
 - There are many opportunities to apply for private scholarships.
 - There is no limit to how much scholarship money you can receive.
 - Scholarships can be **need based** (need through family income) or merit based (academic success).
- *Who?* Most scholarships are for seniors and college students, but there are many available to all different grade levels. High school students are encouraged to start looking and applying as early as 9th grade.

TIP! – Start a scholarship file and save scholarships that you may qualify for even if it's for senior year. That way when you become a senior, you have a list of scholarships to apply for and you already know what you need!

Academic Resources

First Quarter Report Cards were sent home November 10th. This is a great opportunity to review your child's progress towards semester grades.

- *What grades count?* Semester grades are the grades that count towards GPA and college transcripts.
 - Semester grades = 40% Quarter 1 grades + 40% Quarter 2 grades + 20% semester exams
- **Quick Tip**: Sign up on Skyward to receive weekly email updates of your child's grades. Make checking Skyward grades a weekly habit with your student. If you don't have Skyward access, check with Ms. Flinchum in Attendance at extension 234.
- *Help Sessions*: Check teacher help sessions and encourage your child to attend weekly help sessions for courses that need extra support and attention. Students can get extra instruction or just a place to get homework done. The master help session calendar for grades 10-12 is posted on the school counseling website.

PSAT scores should be back in December. Classroom lessons will be planned for grades 10 and 11 to distribute score reports and to review next steps.
