Academic Resources

Progress Reports were sent home on Sept. 29th. This is a great opportunity to review your child's progress towards semester grades.

If your child needs academic support:

- Discuss the course with your child. What challenges are they facing?

College Planning

PSAT Registration opened on September 28th. Cost is \$22 for 9th and 11th graders, free for 10th graders. Payment and registration is done through the Business Office for grades 9 and 11. Fee waivers are available for eligible students. Contact me to obtain fee waiver. The PSAT will be given on October 14th during school hours.

SAT & ACT dates are available in the school planners, online, and in I-106.

College Application Week will be October 26th – 30th. All seniors are expected to apply to at least 2 colleges by October 30th for priority deadlines.

Where in the world is Mrs. Larimer? Highlights from my first 6 weeks of school:

Week 1: Mini introduction to college admissions activity in 10th grade English class

Week 2: Positive Behavior Break-Out Sessions including Code of Conduct, Dress Code, Cyber Safety, and Anti-Bullying presentations from the Student & Family Services team to grades 10-12

Week 3 & 4: College Application Presentation and individual senior conferences during 12th grade English
