## Attendance

Allowed 6 parent notes for excused absences per semester If you have a Doctor's appointment make sure to bring a note. Tardies: if you are tardy to class, go to front office to get a pass.
4 unexcused tardies equal 1 unexcused absence.
10 unexcused absences per semester will result in an attendance contract.
15 unexcused absences per semester will result in possible expulsion.

## Talented Twenty

Students eligible for the Talented Twenty Program have proven academic success in their public high school and are guaranteed admission, within space and fiscal limitations, to one of the twelve state universities.

Students must be in the top $20 \%$ of the class after the posting of the $7^{\text {th }}$ semester ( $1^{\text {st }}$ semester of senior year) and must have met all the 19 prep credits as specified by the State Board of Education Rules.

3. A 430 in Math on the PSAT is the concordant iscore needed to fulfill the graduation requirement 'for the Alg I EOC
