





## **GRADUATION HONORS**

Students who earn 150+ community service hours will receive a cord.



## **VALEDICTORIAN & SALUTATORIAN**

The student with the **highest weighted GPA** will be designated **Valedictorian**.

- 1 P.K. Yonge Valedictorian
- 2 Dual Enrollment Valedictorian

The student with the **second highest weighted** GPA will be designated **Salutatorian**.

- 1 ~ P.K. Yonge Salutatorian
- 2 ~ Dual Enrollment Salutatorian

All high school courses are included including those taken before 9th grade.

Grades shall be calculated through the 7th semester (1st semester, SR year.)

\*A student who transfers to PK Yonge DRS during the last two (2) years prior to graduation is not eligible to be named Valedictorian or Salutatorian.

This award will be announced during the second semester.

### TALENTED TWENTY

Students eligible for the Talented Twenty Program have proven academic success in their public high school and are guaranteed admission, within space and fiscal limitations, to one of the twelve state universities.

Students must be in the top 20% of the class after the posting of the 7th semester (1st semester of senior year) and must have met all the 19 prep credits as specified by the State Board of Education Rules.



### DIPLOMA DESIGNATION

#### State "Scholar" Designation

1 Credit for Algebra 2 or = rigorous math
1 Credit in Statistics or = rigorous math
1 Credit in Chemistry or Physics
1 Credit in a course = rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
Earn 2 credits in the same foreign language
Earn at least 1 credit in AP or a dual enrollment course.
Pass the Geometry EOC exam (Level 3 or higher)
Pass the Biology EOC
Pass the US History EOC





#### Scholar Diploma Designation

In addition to the requirements of section (s.) 1003.4282, Florida Statutes (F.S.), a student must satisfy the following requirements (per. s. 1003.4285, F.S.):

- Earn 1 credit in Algebra 2 or an equally rigorous course
- Pass the Geometry EOC
- Earn 1 credit in Statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
   Pass the Biology 1 EOC\*
- Earn 1 credit in Chemistry or Physics
  Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to Chemistry or Physics
- Pass the U.S. History EOC\*
  Earn 2 credits in the same World Language
- Earn at least 1 credit in an AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course
- \*A student is exempt from the Biology 1 or U.S. History EOC assessment if the student is enrolled in an AP, IB or AICE Biology 1 or U.S. History course; takes the respective AP, IB or AICE assessment; and earns the minimum score to earn college credit.

## Merit Diploma Designation

## State University System (SUS)

Prospective students should complete a rigorous course of study in high school and apply to more than one university to increase their chance for acceptance. To qualify to enter one of Florida's public universities, a first-time-in-college student must meet the following minimum requirements (credit earned by industry certification does not count for SUS admission):

Admission into Florida's public universities is competitive.

- High school graduation with a standard diploma, a minimum of a 2.5 GPA, and admission test scores meeting minimum college-ready test scores per Board of Governors (BOG) Regulation 6.008
   16 credits of approved college preparatory academic
- courses per BOG Regulation 6.0024 English (3 with substantial writing)
- 4 Mathematics (Algebra 1 level and above)
- 3 Natural Science (2 with substantial lab)
  - 3 Social Science
  - 2 World Language (sequential, in the same language or other equivalents)
- 2 approved electives



- o FAS and FMS coursework requirements align with the State University System (SUS) admissions requirements as outlined in 6.002 "Admission of Undergraduate First-Time-in-College, Degree-Seeking Freshmen".
- o The X2 line for FAS and FMS totals the (up to) two extra credits that can be used in FAS and FMS GPA calculations.
- o A Level II or higher Foreign/World Language (FL) course will meet the FL Completer requirement and negate the need for additional FL credits.
- o AICE/IB Courses that count toward AICE/ IB are reflected in the FAS and FMS credit sections.
- o Algebra 1-A (1200370) and Algebra 1-B (1200380) together equal 1.0 credit. Separately, each equals 0.5 credits.

- o Algebra 1-A (1200370) and Algebra 1-B (1200380) together equals 2.0 credits. Separately, each equals 1.0 credits.

Students must submit a Florida Financial Aid Application (FFAA) after October 1 of their senior year and before August 31 in order to be evaluated for an award.




