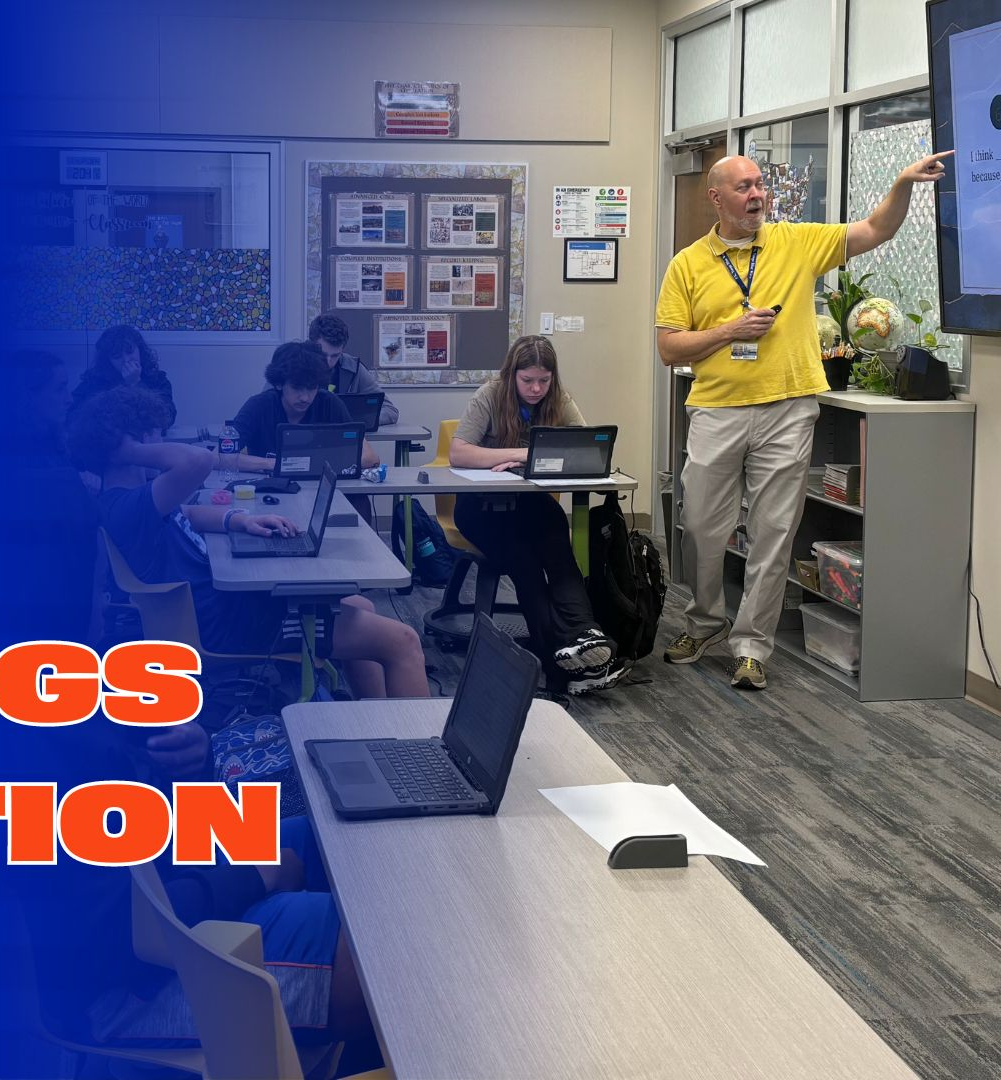

# Attendance

Allowed 6 parent notes for excused absences per semester.

If you have a Doctor's appointment make sure to bring a note.

Tardies: if you are tardy to class, go to front office to get a pass.

4 unexcused tardies equal 1 unexcused absence.

10 unexcused absences per semester will result in an attendance notice.

# 2024-2025 HIGH SCHOOL EXTRACURRICULAR POLICY

## ATTENDANCE

Students who are **habitually absent and/or tardy** may not be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities.

## GRADES

Students must maintain a grade of **Approaching/C or better** in all of their classes. Leniency may be exercised for students who are taking advantage of faculty resources, help sessions, tutoring, etc. There may be other requirements that must be met for participation in certain extracurricular (e.g., FHSAA requires a 2.0 GPA).

## BEHAVIOR

Students **must not have excessive disciplinary issues**; more than five behavior points in a school year may prevent them from participation in extracurriculars.

# Talented Twenty

Students eligible for the Talented Twenty Program have proven academic success in their public high school and are **guaranteed admission, within space and fiscal limitations, to one of the twelve state universities.**

Students must be in the top 20% of the class after the posting of the 7<sup>th</sup> semester (1<sup>st</sup> semester of senior year) and must have met all the 19 prep credits as specified by the State Board of Education Rules.

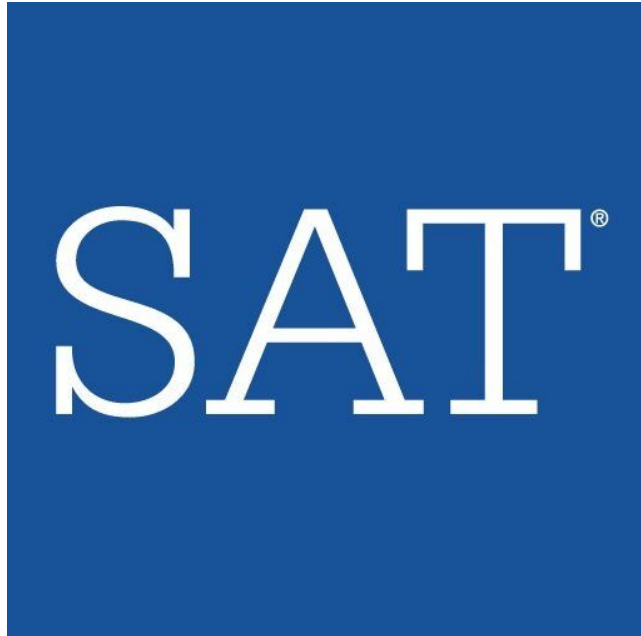
