College Testing

ACT

measures English, math, reading, and science. Each section is scored on a scale of 1-36 and then averaged for a composite score. There is also a writing section scored from 2-12. The writing is not required but if you are applying to competitive Universities, it should be taken at least once. Changes coming in the spring!

SAT

measures reading/writing and math. Each section is scored 200-800 for a composite score of 400-1600. This test is now digital.

CLT

Contains 3 sections: Verbal Reasoning, Grammar & Writing, and Quantitative Reasoning. This test is 2 hours long and **can be taken at home remotely proctored.**

These scores can be sent to colleges, NCAA, etc. Take advantage of this!
