2024-2025 HIGH SCHOOL EXTRACURRICULAR POLICY

ATTENDANCE GRADES BEHAVIOR

Students who are habitually absent and/or tardy may not be eligible to participate in extracurricular activities.

Approaching/C or better in all of their classes. Leniency may be exercised for students who are taking advantage of faculty resources, help sessions, tutoring, etc. There may be other requirements that must be met for participation in certain extracurricular (e.g., FHSAA requires a 2.0 GPA).



This award will be announced during the second semester.

Talented Twenty

Students eligible for the Talented Twenty Program have proven academic success in their public high school and are guaranteed admission, within space and fiscal limitations, to one of the twelve state universities.

Students must be in the top 20% of the class after the posting of the 7th semester (1st semester of senior year) and must have met all the 19 prep credits as specified by the State Board of Education Rules.
