Pre-K at PK: Julia Turner & Jill Ozog working with K-1 and Administration on this process; hoping to level the playing field for these incoming students, would be able to level up students who are working at the kindergarten level; all Pre-K students would automatically move into kindergarten without having to reapply; hoping to begin with 20 students in a one-teacher + one-aide classroom; likely to begin in the art room and move art instruction into the learning communities; pre-k day would be 8am to 2:30pm and considering working with 2 groups for v-pk (morning and afternoon groups); lottery system would be utilized; have worked with BabyGator; conversations with Lassinger Center and Alachua and Levy Counties
