

Pomegranate

Punica granatum

- *Pomegranates in North Florida mature from July to November, but may produce fruit year-round in South Florida.*
- *Some varieties are best for use as ornamentals, while others are grown for eating.*
- *They have glossy, dark green leaves and slender thorny branches.*
- *Their flowers have crinkled petals and can range in color from pale pink to bright orange-red.*
- *The fruits have a smooth, leathery skin and range in color from pinkish-yellow to purplish-red.*
