

Swamp Chestnut Oak

Quercus michauxii

- *Swamp chestnut oak has large, tight canopies.*
- *Their leaves are deciduous, simple, alternate, somewhat oval, dark green, 4–9 inches long, and smooth above, and hairy beneath; they are short-pointed at the tip, tapering to round at the base, with numerous shallow lobes along the edges.*
- *Often, the leaves turn yellow to vibrant red in the fall.*
- *The bark is similar to White Oak—light gray with rough and flaky ridges.*
